We are making great strides in disaster preparedness moving from concerned conversations to action. With fire season already underway, our state governor and legislative leaders are advocating for unprecedented financial support in order to boost firefighting efforts and expand a

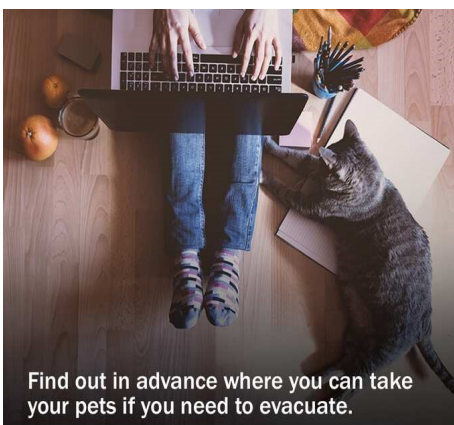
variety of prevention measures across the state. While every dollar spent on prevention is crucial, these potential funds are truthfully about saving lives, homes, and livelihoods.

Last year marked the heaviest wildfire season on record for our state. More than 4 million acres and over 10,000 homes and other structures were burned to the ground by five of the largest fires in the state's recorded history. Devastatingly the loss was far greater than structures, at least 33 lives were lost.

Fire conditions this year could be even worse. Many of California's largest reservoirs are only half full, and winter snow and rain in Northern California have been below their average level. **We must all do our part.**

Pets Depend on Us!

In an emergency, your pets will be even more dependent on you for their safety and well-being. Your family's disaster plans must include your pet family members too. Unfortunately, some pet owners are not prepared when a disaster strikes and many pets are left behind to fend for themselves. Disasters can happen at any time. Pets are family and should never be left behind.

Whether a bird, reptile, dog, cat or other small animal such as gerbils and hamsters, they all depend on you. Learn what to do to keep your

cherished pets safe by preparing for an emergency evacuation and recovery.

BRC has everything you need to help prepare your pets in a disaster. Check out BRC's store line of emergency supplies and vet approved disaster kits for pets here.

Top Tips for Keeping Your Pets Safe During a Disaster

If it's not safe for you to stay in your home during an emergency, it's not safe for them either!

Include supplies for your pet in your emergency kit or assemble an emergency kit for your pet.

Make an evacuation plan for you and your pets. Many hotels and shelters do not accept animal guests, other than service animals.

Pet Basic Disaster Kit should include:

- Food and water for at least five days for each pet, bowls and a manual can opener if you are packing canned pet food. Keep an extra gallon of water on hand for your pets needs and if your pet has been exposed to chemicals or flood waters and needs to be rinsed.
- Store medications and medical records in a waterproof container and a first-aid kit. A pet first-aid book is also a good idea.
- Cat litter box, litter, litter scoop and garbage bags to collect all your pets' waste.
- Sturdy leashes, harnesses and secure carriers to transport pets safely and to ensure that your pets can't escape. Make sure that your cat or dog is wearing a collar and identification that is up to date and visible at all times.
- Current photos of you with your pets and descriptions of your pets to help others identify them in case you and your pets become separated—and to prove that they are yours once you're reunited.
- Written information about your pets' feeding schedules, medical conditions and behavior issues along with the name and number of your veterinarian in case you have to board your pets or place them in foster care.
- A favorite toy for comfort and a familiar blanket for warmth, particularly for smaller pets.

BRC Gets a Shout Out from Corporate HQ!

In a recent corporate newsletter article **4 Imprint** is helping spread the word to thousands of their followers about BRC's efforts to raise awareness when disaster strikes. BRC partnered with **4 Imprint** earlier this year through their corporate One by One program. Here's the article that 4imprint shared.

"If you don't have holes in your boat, then you can help everybody else." That's the mantra of BRC. Faith-based BRC trains people in houses of worship how to assist their community when disaster strikes—from earthquakes to floods to house fires. Affiliated with the local, state and federal government, BRC's services range from preparing facilities to training volunteer emergency teams to providing supplies.

BRC received branded labels for its Mask Up program distributing thousands of two-gallon bags with PPE and emergency preparedness materials. Having branded labels for these lifesaving bags provides awareness of how BRC can help the community in a

disaster.

Since the start of the pandemic, they've distributed more than 50,000 face masks, 2,000 face shields, 1,600 hand sanitizers and more. And with the labels, BRC has spread the word about their work to thousands more people.



"The fact [4imprint is] willing to give us the labels with the one-by-one grant is huge. They do not have to do that. It takes a team effort between non-profits and for-profits to help the community. When they provide a grant like that, it means we can use that money someplace else," CEO Debra Williams said.

One more grand example of corporations and community nonprofits partnering together for success.

Prepare Your Community Resource Corner

What is the Medical Baseline Allowance (MBL)?

If you or someone in your household requires the regular use of electrically-powered medical equipment or device, you may be eligible for MBL. The program provides additional electricity at the lowest baseline rate to help offset the cost of operating medical equipment.

1. MBL is not income qualified – it does not have an income limit
2. No medical professionals signature is required through June 30 – sign up now
3. Many types of medical equipment and devices qualify

Examples of common electrically-powered medical equipment and devices: CPAP machine, powered scooter, electric nebulizer

Heating and/or cooling (A/C) can qualify if medically required for a life-threatening illness, compromised immune system, or temperature sensitivity.

This course is designed to teach you how to assess your current security policies and posture and identify potential threats and vulnerabilities.

A Time to Heal
